

### **REPORT FOR 3 NOVEMBER 2023**

The 5th Division met on 24 October at Hand-Aldrich Post #924 in Hampton Bays. Posts # 388, 419, 834, 924 and 1545 were present. Welcome remarks were made by post commander John Lenihan and dinner was served prior to the meeting. The following reports were received:

1. EAST HAMPTON POST #419 - Post will host reps from Eastport V.A. at on 3 November at 6:00pm, as a follow-on to their visit to Post #388 in September. Post members will participate in Amagansett Elementary School Salute to Veterans on 9 November. Post will participate in Main Street Veterans Day parade on 11 November, with ceremonies immediately following at Hook Mill and reception at post thereafter. Facility rentals continue to go well, post will host training for food service inspection certification on Saturday, 6 January.

2. CHELBERG & BATTLE POST #388 - Post completed repainting of 155mm howitzer. Post will participate in Sag Harbor Elementary School 'Salute to Veterans' on 9 November. Veterans Day parade will commence at 10:00am on 11 November. Post will host Veterans Day dinner starting at 6:30pm on 11 November. Events subcommittee working on plans for Bingo starting in January. N.Y. State Gaming Commission certainly doesn't make it easy. Post planning joint Christmas party with Auxiliary on 11 December. Added 10 names to memorial wall in post ballroom, total now up to 524. Post hosting meetings of Sag Harbor Yacht Club on 3 November and U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary on 21 November.

3. MALCOLM ROSS WHITE POST # 433 - Met w/post commander subsequent to meeting. Post will co-host ceremony in Agawam Park at 3PM on 12 November. Two representatives of the British armed forces - one Army and one Royal Air Force - will present wreaths in honor of American service members lost in past wars. This is part of a 'linking' initiative connecting Southampton with its namesake city in southern England. Pipers and the Southampton High School Chorus will participate and a reception will be held immediately afterward at Prospect & Main (the former John Duck, Jr.). All veterans are welcome to attend.

4. HAND-ALDRICH POST #924 - Post now working on list of Korean War vets to add to 384 WW2 names on memorial wall outside post. Hosted Lions Club bingo on 3 October, proceeds to fund service dogs for vets. Post sponsored visit to LT Michael Murphy Museum on 18 October, received personal tour by museum director. Hosted 'Rocktoberfest' on 21 October w/Mean Gene & the Flamethrowers, all proceeds to go toward Memorial Wall additions. 28-29 October, post manning booth at San Gennaro Feast to recruit new members & sell 50/50 tickets for wall fund. Post notified by NY State that they have been approved for \$75,000.00 grant to install elevator. Paperwork continues. All building permit paperwork in, but informed by Town Building Dep't that it may be 3-4 months before permit is issued. Post initially charged \$6,055 in fees,

but Cynthia McNamara intervened and got fees reversed. In total, she has saved post over \$9K to date. Post CDR advised that on Wednesday, 25 October, Mariners Patriotic Club will host Veterans Appreciation Dinner from 4:30-6:30 at Southampton High School. 13 November post will be distributing turkeys to veterans in need.

5. ARTHUR ELLIS HAMM POST #834 - Adopt-A-Highway program going well, next highway day out is 20 November. Highway department sign now up. Work on new post headquarters to start in January. On 10 November the post will participate in Warriors of Rock Salute to Veterans and First Responders at Westhampton Performing Arts Center at 7PM. Post reaching out to help Westhampton Rehab Center. Post will participate in Honor Flight next May.

6. EASTPORT POST #1545 - Post members participated in the visit of the Traveling Vietnam Wall on 7 October. Post member selected to be grand marshal of this year's Veterans Day parade on 5 November in Center Moriches. On 2 November post members will attend annual Veterans' Appreciation Luncheon hosted by Raynor Country Day School. On 3 November post members will attend Town of Brookhaven Salute to Veterans.. Renovations at post continue. Post received word from U.S. Army Tank-Automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM) that they have been approved for loan of 105mm howitzer for display purposes. Post will hold its own Veterans Day ceremony on 11 November.

7. Div CDR Reminded all posts of ongoing 'Buddy Check Month' in October. Briefed posts on upcoming dues increases. Shared current membership numbers with all posts, stressed that the sooner they get their renewals in, the sooner he and County would stop pressing for them. Briefed posts on large turnout for burial of SGT Bernard Sweeney at Calverton. Reminded posts of SCAL Legislative Breakfast on 28 October and next County meeting on 3 November. Briefed posts on upcoming midwinter Conference on 19-21 January. Of note also, the Sag Harbor VFW Post #9082 is currently sponsoring a display of the Veterans Crisis Line on the large electric sign boards on Sunrise Highway on the west side of the Shinnecock Canal. The display, which any organization may sponsor, runs for 2 weeks and costs \$500.00. Contact the Shinnecock Indian Nation offices for additional details. See photo on next page.



Front door of hospital is getting finished, hopefully by end of this year.

New fiscal year begins on October 1.

PACT Act has only generated about 1.9% increase in patient at VAMC. Other areas it is higher, especially in Florida.
